Édition de BARI, Archivio della Chiesa di San Nicolao, Ms 7 (*olim* 1), Calendrier, ff. [1] - [6v].

Description du manuscrit: Bréviaire de chœur noté, avec calendrier et psautier, 2e moitié du XIIIe siècle-début du XIVE. 419 ff., 335 x 225 mm. Le Sanctoral débute avec la fête de saint André (283r). Le Temporal comprend à Noël le *neuma triplex* parisien (voir Thomas Kelly, "Neuma triplex," *Acta musicologica* 60 [1988]: 13, 23: Bari 7 a le même *neuma* que Bari 2); la *Tabula parisiensis* (ou directoire qui précise la date du premier dimanche de l'Avent et prescrit la disposition des offices de l'Avent, en fonction du jour de la semaine tombant le 25 décembre), ff. 414v-19v, et, à Pâques, le dialogue *Quem queritis* (Walther Lipphardt, *Lateinische Osterfeiern und Osterspiele*, Vol. 6 [Berlin: Walter De Gruyter, 1981], p.221).

Normes d'édition: Cette édition a pris pour modèle l'Appendice I (de l'article avec sigle B, voir ci-dessous) publié par Rebecca Baltzer. Les sigles en lettres sur la gauche de chaque ligne de l'édition indiquent quelles éditions modernes du calendrier parisien contiennent les saints de Bari 7: ces lettres s'appliquent à toute la ligne, les exceptions étant indiquées autrement. Dans le manuscrit, chaque mois occupe une nouvelle page. Les copistes principaux qui ont travaillé sur les exemplaires parisiens-ou du moins français-ont écrit à l'encre brune ou rouge. Une série d'additions est tracée d'une fine écriture de couleur brune. Quelques initiales sont renforcées de touches jaunes. Les trois copistes qui ont écrit ce calendrier utilisent de manière constante un même style de lettres et d'abréviations: ici, les abréviations ont été résolues entre crochets. Les vers égyptiques au début de chaque mois sont écrits à l'encre noire et sont traversés d'un trait rouge (au sujet des jours égyptiques, voir *Oxford Companion to the Year*, éd. Bonnie J. Blackburn & Leofranc Holford Strevens [Oxford, University Press, 1999], p. 590-95). La ligne rouge suivante, barrée d'un trait jaune, indique le nombre de jours et de lunaisons de chaque mois. La colonne de chiffres arabes représentant les dates du calendrier moderne est purement éditoriale. Suivent les colonnes avec le nombre d'or et la lettre dominicale (qui permettent de déterminer la date de Pâques: voir l'explication de Andrew Hughes, *Medieval Manuscripts for Mass and Office: A Guide to the Organization and Terminology* [Toronto: University of Toronto Press, 1981], p. 275-80) et, enfin, la date du mois suivant le système du calendrier romain. L'édition omet la quatrième colonne située à droite de la colonne des dates romaines, qui répète chaque jour la mention des nones, ides ou kalendes.) Les nombres de chaque côté des lettres dominicales sont écrits en rouge dans le manuscrit. Quoique les trois colonnes de ce manuscrit sont les mêmes, en principe, dans tous les calendriers, les erreurs des copistes sont présents, d'où possibilité d'utiliser ces fautes pour identifier les calendriers d'une même famille.

INTRODUCTION IN ENGLISH by Barbara Haggh:

Edition of BARI, Archivio della Chiesa di San Nicolao, Ms 7 (*olim* 1), Calender, ff. [1] - [6v].

Description of the manuscript: notated choir breviary, with calendar and psalter, 2nd half 13th c.-early 14th c.; 419 ff., 335 x 225 mm. The Sanctorale begins with St. Andrew (283r). The Temporale includes, for Christmas, the Parisian neuma triplex (see Thomas Kelly, "Neuma triplex," *Acta musicologica* 60 [1988]: 13, 23: Bari 7 has the same *neuma* as Bari 2) and the complete *tabula parisiensis* (or directory fixing the date of the first Sunday of Advent and prescribing the disposition of offices in Advent, with respect to the day of the week on which the 25th of December falls), on ff. 414v-19v, and, for Easter, a notated *Quem queritis* dialogue (see Walther Lipphardt, *Lateinische Osterfeiern und Osterspiele*, vol. 6 [Berlin: Walter De Gruyter, 1981], p. 221).

Editorial procedure and appearance of the calendar in Bari 7:

This edition took Rebecca Baltzer's appendix 1 (of the article assigned the siglum B: see below) as a model. The letter-sigla to the left on each line of the edition indicate which modern editions of Parisian calendars include the saints of Bari 7: these letters apply to the entire line, except where indicated otherwise. In Bari 7, each month is on a new page. The main scribes, who were working in Bari from Parisian or at least French exemplars, wrote in brown and red ink, but some initials are lined in yellow. One set of additions is in a small brown script. The three scribes who wrote this calendar draw letter shapes and abbreviations consistently. In the edition, abbreviations are resolved in square brackets. The verses about unlucky or 'Egyptian' days, edited here, appear at the top of each page of the manuscript in black ink, with a red horizontal line drawn through them (for further information about these, see *The Oxford Companion to the Year*, ed. Bonnie J. Blackburn and Leo Franc Holford-Strevens [Oxford: Oxford University Press, 1999], p. 590-95). The next line, in red with a horizontal yellow line drawn through it, gives the number of days and the lunar phases in the month of that page. The column of Arabic numerals representing the dates in the modern calendar is editorial. There follow, in the manuscript and in the edition, columns with the golden number and dominical letter (from which the date of Easter could be determined : explanation in Andrew Hughes, *Medieval Manuscripts for Mass and Office: A Guide to the Organization and Terminology* [Toronto: University of Toronto Press, 1981], p. 275-80) and a column giving the date according to the Roman practice. (The edition omits a fourth column to the right of the Roman dates, which lists the nones, ides, or kalends next to each day.) The numbers on either side of the black dominical letters are in red in the manuscript. Although the three columns reproduced in this edition are, in principle, the same in all Western medieval calendars, scribal error is present and might be used to identify related calendars.
